

The 2020 PCCA Spring Meeting

May 15 – May 16, Stockbridge, MA

Meeting Overview

It's been said that if you sit on the porch of **The Red Lion Inn** for twenty minutes, you will have seen the whole world pass by. Located at 30 Main Street, Stockbridge, MA, the Inn stands within the foothills of the bucolic Berkshire Mountains and will serve as our host and headquarters for the Spring 2020 PCCA National Meeting.

A variety of rooms have been reserved for us ranging in price from \$170-\$180/night plus taxes and a "one time" \$15 Preservation Fee. Reserve your room by calling the Reservation Office at 413-298-1690 and reference the Spring 2020 PCCA National Meeting, Group #410568. The Cut-Off Date for our special room rate is April 14, 2020.

The meeting registration fee is \$150 per person, which will include two buffet-style dinners and admission to the iconic, and nearby, Norman Rockwell Museum.

Meeting information packets will be available in the lobby of The Red Lion Inn from 11:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. on Friday. The PCCA Board of Governors Meeting will take place in the beautifully appointed **Townsend Room** from noon until 3:00 p.m., after which PCCA Past President, **Rick Benson** will present the always informative **Introduction to Pewter Orientation**. Available to guests at the Inn as well as membership, this program will also take place within the **Townsend Room** and run until 4:45 p.m.

Our evening festivities will commence at 5:30 p.m. in the Hitchcock Room, where we can catch up with old acquaintances and enjoy a cash bar at the "Meet & Greet" reception and peruse Sales Tables adjacent to the dining hall. Dinner will begin at 6:30 p.m. Following opening remarks by PCCA President George Witman, 1st VP Eric Lanka will introduce our Authenticity Chair Ed Jendry who will deliver a brief presentation on Fakes and Forgeries.

Members are encouraged to bring in any pieces from their collection that may be deemed "suspect." Let's all look and learn. Next, the ever popular

Show & Tell session will be moderated by Eric Lanka. Please bring in pewter for discussion. Robert Werowinski will complete the evening program with a talk on Early English Wrigglework. Again, if you have early British or Continental pieces with wrigglework engraving in your collection, please include them for this infrequently discussed topic.

Saturday morning breakfast is available at the Inn or in a nearby cafe. Following breakfast, we will gather in the lobby of the Inn for a 9:40 a.m. caravan to the **Norman Rockwell Museum**. Once we reach the museum, entrance wristbands will be provided and roving docents will be available to answer any questions regarding the work of this famous and beloved American illustrator.

After touring the museum, lunch is on your own in and around town. During the afternoon you are welcome to visit the many estate gardens, art galleries and antique shops in the area. Information concerning some of these sites can be found on the **Special Activities and Places to Visit** page of this announcement which will also be included in your Registration Packet.

Saturday evening activities will start at 5:30 p.m. with another reception and **Sales Tables** opportunity. Following dinner, **George Witman** will conduct a short business meeting. Then, **Ed McManus** will exhibit some of his restoration work as a preview to the interactive demonstration he will share with us at the Fall Meeting in Lititz, PA. After a short break, Honorary Member, **Mel Wolf** will speak on the topic of **18th Century American Creamers**. The meeting adjourns after a few final announcements.

Remember, the **Cut-Off Date** for our special room pricing is **April 14**. There are a limited number of rooms available to us at this rate and they are only available on a "first come, first served" basis.

Sales Tables

Our Sales Tables offer an opportunity to view quality pewter at fair prices. It's a good way to expand or downsize your collection, or pick up a valuable book about pewter.

Do you have a new piece of pewter you'd like to tell everyone about? Do you have questions about it? Is it old? Is it legitimate antique pewter or is it a fake? Show and Tell is your chance to show off your latest treasure, share a favorite piece, or find out more about a recent acquisition. It's a great way to learn more about pewter. So bring along some pieces for Show & Tell.

Norman Rockwell Museum

Founded in 1969, the Norman Rockwell Museum was originally located on Main Street in Stockbridge. Twenty four years later, in 1993, the museum moved to a brand new and greatly expanded facility just outside of town. At 574 original works, the museum maintains the largest collection of Norman Rockwell paintings, illustrations and drawings including the world famous *Four Freedoms* paintings done in 1943. It also houses over 100,000 items that make up the Norman Rockwell Archives.

In addition to works and special exhibits by Rockwell, the museum sponsors exhibitions by other artists and conducts a variety of lectures, demonstrations and workshops geared to both adults and children. The museum also owns works by many famous illustrators, both past and present, and the original Rockwell studio has been rebuilt on the grounds and will reopen for the season beginning in May.

Berkshire Botanical Garden

Experience Gilded Age style and splendor at this treasured estate, renowned for its elegant gardens and rare 44-room Berkshire "Cottage." Adult visitors: \$20 admission. Seniors and students 15 and up: \$15. The Daffodil and Tulip Festival runs from April 23 through May 17. Open Thursday – Sunday 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. (no house tours). Driving Directions

FROM THE EAST

Take the Mass Pike (Rt. 90) WEST towards Albany, NY. As you approach Lee, MA take exit 2 for US-20E – 0.6 mi. Keep left at the fork and follow signs for US 20E/MA-102/MA-7/Stockbridge/Great Barrington. Continue for 250 feet. Use the right lane to turn left onto US 20E - 150 feet. Turn right onto MA-102W - continue for 4.6 mi. The Red Lion Inn will be on your left.

FROM THE WEST

Stay on the New York Thruway EAST towards Albany. Pass by the Capitol and continue on RT. 90E towards Boston. Take exit B3 for NY-22 toward Austerlitz/New Lebanon for .03 mi. Turn right onto NY-22S for 0.7 mi. Turn left onto State Hwy 980D for 2.7 mi., at which time you will be entering MA. Turn right onto MA-102E/MA-41S for 5.3 mi. The Red Lion Inn will be on your left.

FROM THE SOUTH

Follow RT 87N to Albany. Follow 1-87N toward Albany. Take exit 21A toward 1-90E/Boston. Stay on this road for 23 mi. Take exit B3 for NY-22 toward Austerlitz/New Lebanon. After 0.3 mi, turn RIGHT onto NY-22S and continue for 0.7 mi. Then turn LEFT onto State Hwy 980D. After 2.7 mi. turn RIGHT onto MA -102E/MA 41S and continue for 5.3 mi. The Red Lion Inn will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH

Follow I-91S until you pass Holyoak, MA. And approach the Mass Pike (I-90). Take exit 14 and follow the signs for I-90W/Albany. Continue WEST for 35 mi. Take exit 2 for US-20E and travel 0.6 mi. Use the middle lane to keep left at the fort and follow signs for US-20E/MA-102/MA-7/Stockbridge/Great Barrington. After 250 feet, use the right lane to turn left onto US-20E., travel 150 feet turn RIGHT onto MA-102W and follow for 4.6 mi. The Red Lion Inn will be on your left.

The nearest major airport for The Red Lion Inn is in Albany, NY (ALB-Albany Intl.).
